# Junior Secondary iPads

Technology is a driving force in the world today. It also introduces some remarkable opportunities for schools to expand what's possible for teaching and learning.

Students will be provided an Apple iPad as part of the Student Resource Scheme package. Prior to proposing and planning this device, considerable research and consultation occurred to ensure the most appropriate and informed decisions were made.

Apple has always designed products that make learning personal and empowers the creative genius in all of us. We've chosen the Apple platform because it aligns with our goals and is fully supported by Education Queensland. The iPad has the varied functionality that will allow students to consume and produce information in a mobile form through:

- Textbooks available on the iPad in eBook formats using the Campion app.
- A carefully selected range of classroom apps including QLearn the education department's own digital learning management system for students and staff.
- Resources that are available at all times.

Students will be required to follow a range of expectations in order to permit full learning engagement, device protection and appropriate conduct in the school setting.

# Years 7, 8 and 9 iPads

As of 2025, all Year 7, 8 and 9 students, must participate in the school Take-Home iPad scheme.

It has been determined that students have less disruption to their learning if supplied with a school iPad. School supplied iPads are less likely to experience technology issues. They provide seamless enrolment to our network, on demand school apps, unlimited technical support, and device management controls.

As part of the Year 7 Student Resource Scheme (SRS) we are offering:

- 1. Take-Home iPad hire is included in the SRS fees. Students will have the use of an iPad provided by the school. These may be 2nd hand devices which have been previously used by other students. A basic maintenance service is provided by the school with a replacement device provided if it requires servicing. The iPad will be returned at the end of each year.
- 2. Other. I am unable or do not wish for my child to participate in the Apple iPad Junior School program. As part of the enrolment process, we will discuss options with families to ensure all students have access to learning materials and experiences.

# Senior Secondary Years 10, 11 and 12 Laptop

As students progress to senior schooling, subjects change and so does the device requirements. A laptop is a better fit for senior students, as it prepares our senior students' progression into the workforce. A laptop will also meet all the requirements of the subjects on offer for senior schooling.

BYO Device is where a student's own device is configured to connect to the school's IT system, internet and printers. There is no cost for this service. If students choose to bring their own device they will have internet, network and printer access whilst at school through our wireless network.

Student devices should meet our organisational requirements and can be procured from different sources. A number of suppliers offer suitable devices and fully understand our requirements, including after sales service, extended warranty and accidental damage insurance.



# UNIFORM DRESS CODE

The Stanthorpe State High School uniform policy reflects the values within the local community and has been determined by a committee representing parents, teachers, students and is endorsed by the P & C Association. The uniform has been designed to contribute and support a healthy and safe learning environment which allows students to participate in all school activities.

The appearance of students contributes significantly to the reputation of the school. All students are expected to wear the uniform in the manner in which it was designed and approved to be worn, and to present a smart and tidy appearance.

## **Procedures**

Students are required to have at least one Formal Uniform and one Practical Uniform.

Trade Training Uniform and Hospitality Training Uniform as required according to subjects studied.

Students are required to be in school uniform at all times unless indicated otherwise.

Formal uniform can be worn daily and must be worn for the following:

- Specific Excursions
- School photo days
- Full School Assemblies
- At the request of a teacher for a specific activity
- Awards Night
- Representing the school

Practical Uniform can be worn daily and

- any day the student has physical education, sport or a practical subject
- at the request of a subject teacher for a specific activity
- Students studying VET Certificates in Years 10, 11 and 12 predominantly delivered in a nonclassroom environment

# **General Appearance**

Jewellery must conform with all aspects of the Workplace Health and Safety Act. Hair should be clean and tidy and must be tied back for practical subjects. It is recommended that hair be within the natural range of hair colours. Accessories should conform to school colours and not be excessive or create risk to self or others.



Skin toned foundation with an SPF can be worn by all year levels. No other make-up should be obvious. Clear or neutral coloured nail polish is acceptable.

### School Hat

All students must wear the prescribed reversible school hat for all outdoor activities including lunch breaks.

# SCHOOL TRANSPORT

**ASSISTANCE SCHEME (STAS)** 

# The School Transport Assistance Scheme (STAS) is:

- one of the largest assistance programs provided by the Queensland Government
- a scheme to provide assistance to eligible students who don't have a school in their local area
- administered by the Department of Transport and Main Roads.

## Who is eligible?

Primary and secondary students may be eligible for assistance under STAS if they:

- · attend an approved school
- are younger than 19 years of age
- are seeking transport assistance to and from one address only
- make a minimum of two trips per week via the indicated transport mode
- have parents or guardians who are residents of Queensland.

Students must also meet specific criteria that applies to the type of transport assistance sought.

# What types of transport assistance are available? Bus transport assistance

Students using their designated service who satisfy the general conditions of the scheme may be eligible for bus travel assistance to and from school if they also meet the criteria below.

• Distance eligible students

To be eligible for distance-based assistance:

- primary school students must live more than 3.2km from the nearest state primary school
- secondary school students must live more than 4.8km from the nearest state secondary school
- students attending non-state schools must live more than the distance criteria from both the nearest state and non-state school of the type attended.

All measurements are by the shortest trafficable route and are based on the nearest school which offers the required year level.

To be eligible for safety-net assistance:

- Safety-net eligible students
- primary school students must live 3.2km or less from the nearest state primary school
- secondary school students must live 4.8km or less from the nearest state secondary school
- students attending non-state schools must live less than the required distance from either the nearest state or non-state school of the type attended.

All measurements are by the shortest trafficable route and are based on the nearest school which offers the required year level.

The student must be listed as a dependant on the applicant's:

- Health Care Card issued by the Department of Human Services
- Pensioner Concession Card issued by the Department of Human Services
- Department of Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession

Students who have a card issued in their own name, as well as students under a Child Protection Order issued by Child Safety Services, may also qualify for safety-net assistance.

# Conveyance allowance

In some areas it is necessary for parents to make private arrangements for the transport of their students to and from school, or to and from a bus service or train station. These families may be eligible for the payment of conveyance allowance to help with the cost of this travel.

To be eligible for conveyance allowance:

- primary school students must live more than 3.2km from the nearest state primary school
- secondary school students must live more than 4.8km from the nearest state secondary school
- students attending non-state schools must live more than the distance criteria from both the nearest state and non- state school of the type attended.

All measurements are by the shortest trafficable route and are based on the nearest school which offers the required year level.

Assistance may also be available for non-state school students living outside the Brisbane City Council local government boundary. Families may qualify based on the distance criteria to the nearest school of type – irrespective of the distance to the nearest state school.

Eligibility for conveyance allowance is dependent on other factors such as the types of bus services operating in the area and the distance to the nearest bus service.

## Assistance for isolated students

Increased assistance under STAS is available for students in isolated parts of the state. To be eligible for assistance under this package, students must:

- live in an isolated area as designated by the Director-General, Department of Transport and Main Roads
- live more than 16km from the nearest state school
- live more than 16km from the nearest approved bus service which can transport the student to school.

# Assistance for English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) Students

English as an additional language or dialect (EAL/D) students enrolled in an Intensive Language Unit (ILU) approved by the Department of Education may be eligible for 12 months transport assistance.

This assistance is provided from the original date of enrolment in an ILU. School principals may approve an additional six months travel assistance for students requiring continued enrolment in the program.

## Assistance for students with a disability

All enquiries about transport assistance for students with a disability should be directed to the school attended or the relevant Department of Education regional office.
