

Course Outline: The Year 10 curriculum provides a study of the history of the modern world and Australia from 1918 to the present, with an emphasis on Australia in its global context. The 20th century became a critical period in Australia's social, political, economic, cultural, environmental and political development. The transformation of the modern world during a time of political turmoil, global conflict and international cooperation provides a necessary context for understanding Australia's development, its place within the Asia-Pacific region and its global standing, and the demands for rights and recognition by First Nations Australians.

Learning Experiences:

- Interpreting and analysing sources (primary and secondary)
- Considering different historical perspectives
- Interpreting and debating historical events
- Investigating historical continuities and change, cause and effect and significance
- Researching & investigating using an inquiry process

Duration: 1 year.

Units:

- World War Two
- Building Modern Australia (Rights & Freedoms)

Assessment:

- Short Response exam using stimulus
- Investigation & historial essay
